Mae prosiect ar gyfer Cymuned Amlwch ymhlith y rhai sy'n mynd i'r afael â newid yn yr hinsawdd diolch i arian achosion da'r Loteri Genedlaethol.

Mae Cyngor Tref Amlwch mewn partneriaeth â Caru Amlwch wedi derbyn grant o dros £ 9982 gan Gronfa Gymunedol y Loteri Genedlaethol i ddatblygu ardal ym Mharc Ion Goch i greu gardd dyfu gymunedol, safle cadwraeth bywyd gwylt a chanolbwynt natur addysgol.

Mae'r grant yn rhan o beilot yng Nghymru i gefnogi prosiectau presennol y Loteri Genedlaethol i weithredu yn eu cymunedau i fynd i'r afael â'r argyfwng hinsawdd. Y llynedd, cyhoeddodd Cronfa Gymunedol y Loteri Genedlaethol ei bod yn ymrwymo £ 100 miliwn dros 10 mlynedd i gefnogi cymunedau ledled y DU i fynd i'r afael â newid yn yr hinsawdd.

Gwnaethpwyd y grant yn bosibl diolch i bryniannau tocynnau chwaraewyr y Loteri Genedlaethol.

Derbyniodd grwpiau cymunedol gefnogaeth gan Adnewyddu Cymru a Chymunedau Cynaliadwy Cymru i nodi pa gamau newid hinsawdd y dylent eu cymryd a pha effaith gadarnhaol y gallai hyn ei chael.

Amlwch Town Council to tackle climate emergency thanks to National Lottery funding

A project for the Amlwch Community is among those tackling climate change thanks to National Lottery good causes money.

Amlwch Town Council in partnership with Caru Amlwch have been awarded a grant of over £9982 from The National Lottery Community Fund to develop an area at Ion Goch Park to create a community grow garden , wildlife conservation site and educational nature hub.

The grant is part of a pilot in Wales to support existing National Lottery projects to take action in their communities to tackle the climate emergency. Last year The National Lottery Community Fund announced that it is committing £100 million over 10 years to support communities across the UK to tackle climate change.

The grant has been made possible thanks to National Lottery players' ticket purchases.

Community groups received support from Renew Wales and Sustainable Communities Wales to identify what climate change action they should take and what positive impact this could have.

Welcoming the grant, Liz Wood, Chair, Amlwch Town Council said: "Securing the National Lottery Climate Action Top Up grant will enable the Town Council to develop an area within the town park specifically for nature and the environment. The funding is a welcome boost following the £100k secured from the National Lottery Community Fund earlier in the year in partnership with Caru Amlwch towards the development of play areas in the town."
